The Ship of the Church. In the Gospel, as today, there are many instances of Jesus & the Apostles in a boat. The founder of Western theology Tertullian referred to the Church as a ship, a vessel of salvation: "That little ship did present a figure of the Church, in that she is disquieted 'in the sea,' that is, in the world 'by the waves,' that is, by persecutions and temptations; the Lord, through patience, sleeping as it were, until, roused in their last extremities by the prayers of the saints, He checks the world, and restores tranquility to His own."

ST MARY'S FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS: Thank you to the parents & children for the renewed commitment to attend Mass each Sunday. The children's presence at Mass greatly enhances our Sunday experience and is much commented on by other parishioners. Don't forget to sign "Golden Book" at the back of church for the children to make a

record of their prayers and attendance at Mass for each Sunday until their First Communion as a gift for Jesus. Attendance at Mass & the preparation sessions are a pre-requisite of being able to make First Communions.

FIRST CONFESSIONS: These are now taking place over 4 Saturday mornings in church, so the children can experience the Sacrament in it's normal place, to hopefully encourage them to come again in the ordinary course of their spiritual lives. There are 4 slots on each of the mornings for you to sign up for, the times allotted will also give enough




space for parents and siblings to come to Confession as well, to set the best example for the children. As it is said in the Sacrament of Baptism, "Parents are the first and best teachers of their children."

8th February: 15th February. You will also find there some little booklets to assist you in preparing the children, which will also be available on the day they come to Confession.

FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES. WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE SICK. Many of us will know of



people who are sick or unwell, in body, mind or spirit - and perhaps we fall into one of those categories ourselves. On Tuesday we have an opportunity to remind us to care for their souls as well as their bodies by praying for them on this most fitting day. Faith and prayer can be a great consolation when we are suffering and a source of strength.

Offering up your sufferings is a practice long established in the Church, that allows individuals to unite their pain and struggles with the suffering of Christ and to offer it as a prayer for the good of others. It expresses solidarity with Christ's sacrifice and a way to participate in His redemptive work. The idea is that, though you cannot escape the suffering, you can offer it for a higher purpose, such as for someone's conversion, healing, or well-being, or alleviating any suffering in the world.

How to Offer Up Suffering? When you experience pain, you can consciously choose to unite your suffering with the suffering of Jesus Christ. This is typically done by making a small prayer or intention. You don't need to share the personal struggles of the person you're praying for. Instead, you can simply ask God to apply the offering of your pain to help that person in whatever way God sees fit.

For example, you could pray something like: "Lord, I offer up the pain of this migraine for [this person], asking You to bring them comfort, healing, or strength in their struggle.

May my suffering unite with Your suffering to bring grace into their life."

Or you might say: "Jesus, I unite my pain with Yours, offering it for the souls in purgatory, for the poor, or the Church." The key is the intention and the willingness to embrace the suffering with faith and trust in God's purpose.



INSALLATION MASS WITH ARCHBISHOP MALCOLM:

NEXT Sunday 16th February at the 10.30am Mass.

Archbishop Malcolm will celebrate Mass to formally install Fr Simon as the Parish Priest of our newly re-formed parish. Obviously, it would be good for as many parishioners as possible to attend the Mass that weekend, even if you usually attend at the 8.30am Mass at St Mary's or at St Catherine's church, as it is an event for the whole parish.

There will be refreshments served afterwards in the Social Centre - using the main hall rather than the smaller room usually in use for this.

The Installation takes the form of the priest renewing his profession of the Faith and assenting to the duties the Archbishop questions him about.

Canon Law puts it this way:

Canon 218 - § 1. The pastor is obliged to see to it that the word of God in its entirety is announced to those living in the parish; for this reason he is to see to it that the lay Christian faithful are instructed in the truths of the faith, especially through the homily which is to be given on Sundays and holy days of obligation and through the catechetical formation which he is to give; he is to foster works by which the spirit of the gospel, including issues involving social justice, is promoted; he is to take special care for the Catholic education of children and of young adults; he is to make every effort with the aid of the Christian faithful, to bring the gospel message also to those who have ceased practicing their religion or who do not profess the True Faith.

§2. The pastor is to see to it that the Most Holy Eucharist is the centre of the parish assembly of the faithful; he is to work to see to it that the Christian faithful are nourished through a devout celebration of the sacraments and especially that they frequently approach the sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist and the sacrament of penance; he is likewise to endeavor that they are brought to the practice of family prayer as well as to a knowing and active participation in the sacred liturgy, which the pastor must supervise in his parish under the authority of the diocesan bishop, being vigilant lest any abuses creep in.
